Look at all we accomplished together!

- 51 Walls built for a 3BR home in Morgan Co, Indiana
- 15 Bunk beds built for families in Butler Co, Ohio
- 32 Stuffed animals made to be delivered with the bunk beds
- 82,572 Meals packed for students at Living Water Mission in Haiti
- 200 Food bags packed for local school students
- 200 Hygiene bags packed for local school students
- 300 Care bags packed for children in foster care
- 275 Encouragement cards written
- 56 Shoe patterns assembled for shoes for kids in Africa
- 250 Care bags packed for those in cancer treatment
- 1 lot of land cleared in Price Hill for Weightless Anchor Ministry

Meals arrived in Haiti on Sunday, August 25. Below is an update and photos from Salonique Adolphe, Director of Living Water Mission:

This past Sunday, we received 396 boxes of food from A Child Hope International and US Air Force assured the transportation. (That's us, you all - good job!) Last year, they did the same and we were able to feed the children. This feeding program was one of biggest success factor of the school year. The students had no trouble to learn. They had no concern coming to school, consequently we had a great school year. Now the amount of food we have will not be able to feed the kids for the whole year. We will have way many more kids, probably 50% more than last year. But we are confident that we have enough food for the first term of the school and the first month of the second term. I pray by this time we have a solution to feed the kids the rest of the school year.

- Picnics in The Parking Lot: 1,400+ lunches served, 300+ food bags sent home with students
- Wheels: 5 cars
- Thrivepointe Counseling: 15 (average) clients seen monthly
- Food Pantry: Pounds of food distributed: 56,028
- Mobile Food Pantry Truck for 10 consecutive weeks
- People shopped for: 1,726
- Financial Resourcing: 28 applications approved to support housing or utilities; 2 widows had minor home repairs completed through a new ministry HOGs (Handymen of God)
